

Personal budgets

For children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)



What is a personal budget?

A personal budget is an amount of money given for children and young people who need extra support



The personal budget supports the child or young person to meet the **outcomes** in their **EHC** plan



outcomes means the results we want to see

EHC stands for Education, Health and Care



Who can have a personal budget?

You can ask for a personal budget

 when the Council has agreed to make an EHC plan



during a review of an EHC plan



What can a personal budget pay for?

Families can ask for personal budgets for

• Education - e.g. transport



• Health - e.g. continuing care



Social care - e.g. short breaks

Who looks after my personal budget?

There are 4 ways to manage your personal budget



 a direct payment can be paid to a parent or carer (or sometimes to the young person) so they can buy services based on their EHC plan



 a family can ask someone else to manage the money for them



 a family can ask the Council or the NHS (Camden Clinical Commissioning Group) to manage the money for them



 a family can choose to have a mix of all 3 ways of managing the money



What's good about having a personal budget?



Having a personal budget can

give families more choice and control



 help the child or young person get the right support



Personal budgets may not be right for everyone

You can talk about this with your **assessment coordinator** or **keyworker**
